THE ATB-ALL TERRAIN BUCKET SYSTEM The labor saving multiple container transport system

The cover is removed from the back. Place one hand on the wing of the bucket where the handle attaches and the other hand on one of the 3 latches on the back of the lid. Lift the latch. Then proceed to lift the other 2 latches in the same manner. The cover is now free to be removed.

Take your hose or water source and fill the bucket to the 5 gallon fill line. Do not exceed 5 gallon fill line when transporting water in the ATB Cart. 20 quarts of grain, supplements or 20 lbs of pet food can be stored and transported in the ATB Buckets with covers.

The lids are replaced onto the buckets by firmly pushing down on the cover from the front circling around to the back. This creates a vacuum seal. Then push on each latch; one, two, three at the back of the lid until you hear it snap into place. Now your cover is firmly in place and you are ready to move your slosh free buckets.

The ATB-All Terrain Buckets with lids nest nicely one on top of the other due to the design of the cover. These Buckets also nest nicely into the cart as the bottom of the bucket will fit into the cross bars of the base of the cart. The sides of the buckets have wings that are designed to prevent the buckets from moving side to side once they are placed onto the cart. The bungee that comes with your ATB system can further secure the top bucket by hooking it to the sides of the vertical frame and around the front of the top bucket.

We recommend that you place your empty ATB- Bucket on to the cart, fill, cover and then place your second empty ATB-Bucket on top of the first covered bucket, fill it, cover it.

Once the ATB-All Terrain Buckets are nested into the ATB-Cart you are ready to move. At the back of the cart, place you foot on the base and tip the cart back toward you. You now have the option of pulling or pushing the ATB System to your destination. I prefer the pulling method.
